

Creating the conditions in which all our students can be successful is a very exact science. Success is fuelled by optimism, a disposition to believe that, with enterprise and hard work, our best shots will be rewarded.

How do we foster such a spirit? We do it by working hard to make every student feel safe, understood and valued.

Knowing what you do about schools, you understand that individuality can thrive only in the most rigorously administered and attentive community. Our students are at a stage in their growing up when they can make life difficult for themselves and for others, so it is crucially necessary for us to spot a problem early and nip it in the bud. Our students are also at a stage when they unexpectedly reveal a talent no one ever knew they had.

Again, we need to be there for them at once, to urge them on and celebrate achievement. There are vital lessons to be learned from both failure and success.

We have systems and structures and staffing levels, of course. We have monitoring and reporting and appraisal. Information is rapidly shared. And we listen. Students have their say in the school council. Parents tell us we respond promptly to their concerns. Ofsted inspectors like the way we do things.

Above all, we have a powerful culture of kindness and friendship. We have values which are preached in Chapel and pervade everything that happens here. Everyone is valued equally; day students treated exactly the same as boarders.

Academic

Life in the classroom at Ellesmere is seriously challenging - but never crushing.

The world of work calls for more than just good exam results, it calls for qualities of character and personality. At Ellesmere College we develop all of these too.

But best-possible grades are an essential passport to success - and hard work is an essential cultivator of character. Here, as at any school, getting it right in the classroom matters most.

Some students at Ellesmere are extremely clever. That does not make them better people and we do not focus on them at the expense of everybody else. We expect all students, however bright, to measure themselves only against the best work of which they are capable, and we celebrate the success of every person who tries their hardest - whatever their grades.

Our philosophy is that everyone learns differently and that every learning style is a special gift, never a special need. We also know that students develop at different rates and at different times.

This is why our enhanced curriculum includes the International Baccalaureate (potentially the equivalent of 6 A levels) alongside conventional A levels.



There are no also-rans at Ellesmere.



As in all things, we enable the very best to reach a national audience. We offer Arts awards and scholarships to outstanding students and nurture their talent with the very best teaching.




In short, all the qualities needed for a lifetime of successful adulthood. And that's the point.



The day parents join the Ellesmere community they are embraced by the Parents' Society and join a vibrant and active social group run by parents for parents with the welfare of the school at heart.


Just as our students form lifelong friendships here, so do their parents.
