Year 11 (Preliminary and HSC Courses)

In Year 11 at Taylors College, students select subjects that they will study over two years in Year 11 and Year 12. English is the only compulsory subject. Year 11 students need to study six subjects and Year 12 study a minimum of five subjects. The five subjects of the Year 12 year must have been studied in Year 11. 
