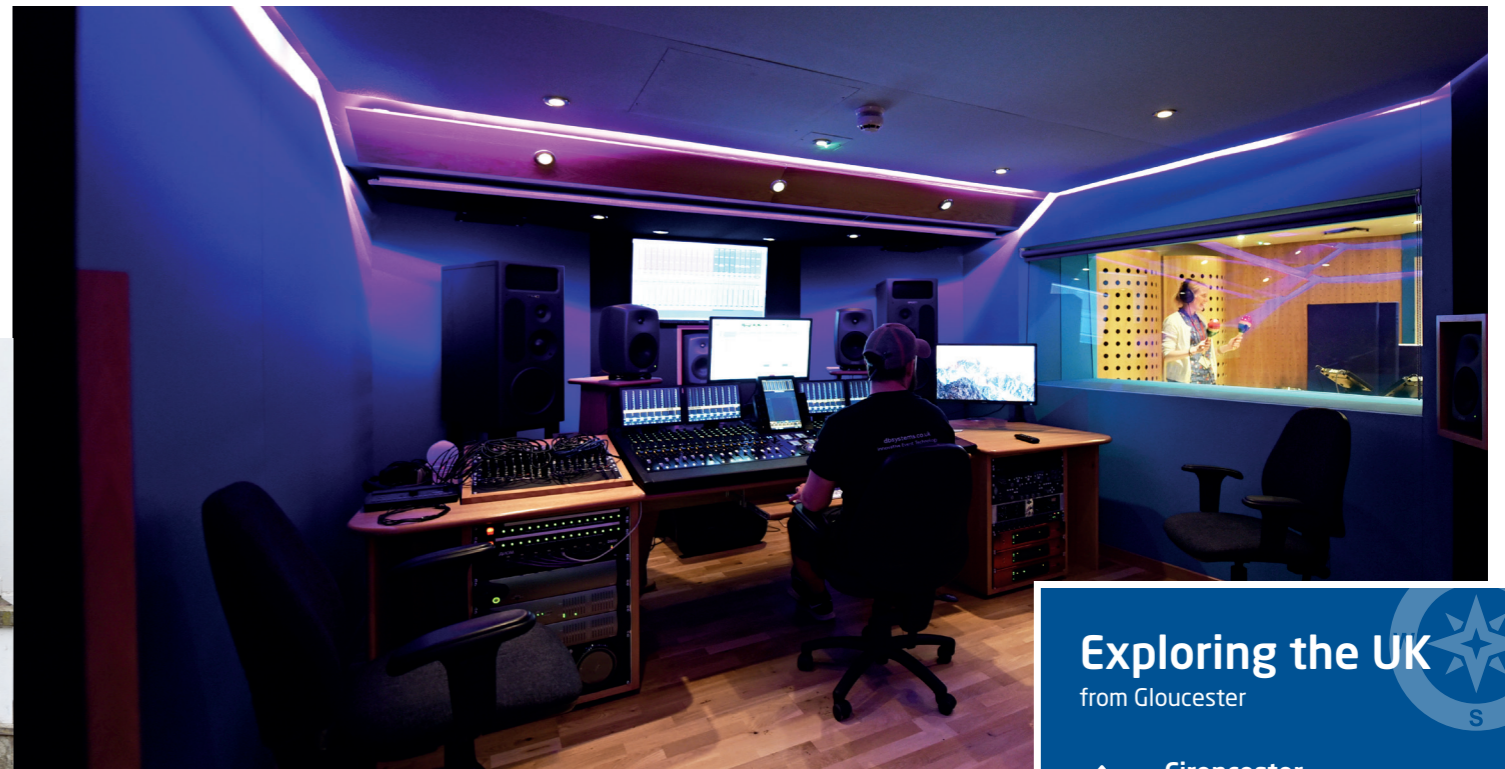

Your Study Centre

The Centre is located on Park campus in the newly-refurbished Pallas Villa and Cornerways buildings, which are close to everything you need - from the library to the Students' Union. From the moment you arrive, you'll become a real part of the University community, getting to know students from countries all over the world and exploring your new surroundings.

Festival scene

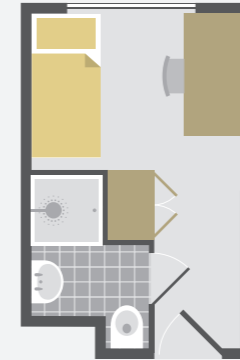
