Studying Medicine in the UK

If you plan to study Medicine in the UK, you should expect to study for at least 6 years before you complete your bachelor degree

Your studies may involve:


- A 1 year Foundation in Medicine, usually for people who have done non-science A Levels
- 2 years of A Level study (Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics) including specialist medical enrichment
- A 5 year undergraduate degree (or sometimes 6 for more in-depth study)
- 2 years of a postgraduate foundation course (two-year training programme for newly qualified doctors)
- 3-8 years of specialist training, for example Paediatrics.

However, entry to Medical School is fiercely competitive. Many, even outstanding, students do not get into a Medical School straight after studying A Level.

For these students, their route to Medicine could look like the following:

- You will need to complete a first degree in a related subject, often Biomedical Science, before starting the 5 year Medical Degree (MBBS).
- · You can start a first degree in a related subject and apply again to study Medicine through UCAS the following year.
- · Sometimes you can transfer off a related degree at the end of the first year, and on to Medicine at the same University, but you will have to seriously impress.
- · Alternatively you can take a gap year and apply again through UCAS. You will then be applying with your actual A Level grades, rather than predicted and GCSEs. You can do something interesting with the time to improve your Personal Statement.

THE CHART BELOW SHOWS THE ROUTES TO MEDICINE



Regardless of whether you decide to complete a first degree or take a gap year, you will need to apply again through UCAS.



What qualifications are needed?

Medicine is a very competitive discipline. Each year, over 80,000 students apply for only 7,500 places, with Dentistry and Veterinary Medicine being equally as competitive. To ensure a place, good preparation is key.

As a potential student, you will require high grades particularly in science. You will need to achieve three full A Levels, or the equivalent, in the relevant subjects. Popular subject choices to consider include Chemistry, Biology and either Physics or Mathematics, all at an A grade standard.

To study in the UK, you will also need a high command of the English language. You will need an overall IELTS score of 7.0, but some universities could ask for a score of 7.5 in all components.

Academic skills aren't the only things necessary when applying to medical school. Students must have perseverance, initiative, originality, concern for others and the ability to communicate. Any practical skills gained in hospitals, care homes and hospices are also beneficial when applying and having a good understanding of the UK's National Health Service can also set you apart from the crowd.

The exact entry requirements of each medical school are different. At Bellerbys, your programme manager will be able to advise you of the requirements of the universities you are interested in applying to.

The deadline for applications to study Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Medicine in the UK is 15th October one year before starting your studies. This deadline is the same for all applicants – domestic and international. You can apply for up to four medical courses that interest you.

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Additional entry requirements

The majority of medical, dental and veterinary schools will require you to complete an admissions test. Depending on the university, you will take either the UK Clinical Aptitude Test (UKCAT) or the Biomedical Admissions Test (BMAT).

UKCAT

- The UKCAT is required by most medical schools that you can apply to through UCAS.
- UKCAT does not contain any science content, but helps universities select applicants based on their attitudes, mental abilities and professional behaviours.
- The test must be taken between 1st July and 5th October in the same year that you are applying to medical schools.

BMAT

- The BMAT is a subject-specific admissions test taken by applicants to certain courses.
- The BMAT is required by seven schools for medicine, one for dentistry, two for veterinary medicine and some biomedical courses.
- · All students take the test on the same day, in the first week of November.

At Bellerbys, we make sure that our students enter for both UKCAT and BMAT. All students taking the UKCAT or BMAT are expected to have a good command of English. No extra time is allowed for students whose first language is not English.





Bellerbys College Brighton Elite Medics Programme

Bellerbys Brighton offers a unique programme for gifted students looking to study Medicine. The programme has been developed in partnership with Brighton and Sussex Medical School (BSMS) and can lead to their Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (BM BS) degree.

As part of this programme, students are **guaranteed an** interview to study at Brighton and Sussex Medical School.

The Elite Medics Programme provides students with additional teaching hours, personal tutor sessions and a range of clinical and academic enrichment activities with BSMS staff.

Entry requirements

To study on the Elite Medics Programme, you must achieve:

- 5 GCSEs A*-B (including Chemistry and Maths at A* or A)
- An IELTS score of 6.0 with no less than 5.5 in any

You will also need:

- To attend an interview with two senior academic programme managers

The start dates for the Elite Medics Programme are September, January and April.

Progression from the Elite Medics Programme

In order to be offered a place to study at the BSMS to study the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery, students will need to achieve:

- A successful interview with the BSMS
- AAA grades, including Biology and Chemistry (Physics and Maths are common third choices, but other subjects from the Arts or Humanities are welcomed).
- An IELTS score of 7.0, with no less than 7.0 in any component.

Elite Medics students will also have the opportunity to apply to up to four medical schools through UCAS.

Who are Brighton and Sussex Medical School?

Founded in 2002 with modern, purpose built teaching facilities, the BSMS students experience a practical approach to studying medicine. The school offers early patient contact in GP practices and hospitals. BSMS is:

- One of 32 medical schools in the UK recognised by the General Medical Council.
- · An equal partnership between the University of Brighton and the University of Sussex.
- · Ranked 16th for Medicine in the Guardian University League Tables 2018 and equal 18th in The Times/Sunday Times Good University Guide 2018.

Elite Medics programme structure

As an Elite Medics student, you can study either the five or six term A Level programme starting in either September, January or April. The programme includes three A Levels in Biology, Chemistry and Mathematics, as well as an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). You will be encouraged to choose a non-science subject for your EPQ, as BSMS appreciate candidates who have studied the Arts or Humanities to A Level standard.

Entry requirements

To study on the Science and Pharmacy Foundation, you must have:

- · A satisfactory completion of secondary or high school education

Our Foundation programme is accepted by the following medical schools:



Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, to study the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery

Founded in 1784 as a surgical training college, the RCSI is one of the most international medical schools in the world. The school is at the forefront of healthcare education and has a culturally diverse environment with over 50 nationalities.

To study at the RSCI, you will need to achieve:

- An overall score of 70% across all modules, with no less than 60% in any single module
- A minimum score of **75% in Chemistry**
- An IELTS score of 6.5 with no less than 6.0 in any component

The RSCI offer a five or six year programme. Entry into the five year programme will only be considered for students achieving significantly higher grades and will be assessed on an individual basis.



University of Central Lancashire (UCLan), to study the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery

A programme designed primarily for international students, UCLan helps students become professional, compassionate doctors. Based in the newest medical school in the UK, you will benefit from a state-of-the-art curriculum and enjoy early patient contact. The programme is delivered by expert staff and NHS education providers.

To study at UCLan, you will need to achieve:

- 80% or higher in the Science and Pharmacy Foundation, including the Clinical Services half module
- An overall IELTS score of 7.0 with no less than 7.0 in any component
