If you have IELTS 4.0 (minimum 4.0 in all bands) or equivalent, you will need one term of ELP. You can start in June, prior to starting your academic programme in September, or you can start in September, prior to starting in January.



English Language Preparation

You will need an IELTS 5.5 in all components or equivalent to start the International Year One. If you have IELTS 5.0, we offer 8 weeks of complimentary English Language Preparation free to any student joining the programme. We also offer a 4 week complimentary course for students with IELTS 5.5, but lower component scores. For students with an IELTS of 4.5 (minimum of 4.0 in all components), you will need to take a full term of English Language Preparation.


