Suffolk University partners with INTO to create a support system for international students. We offer Academic English, International Year One, Undergraduate Transfer Program, Graduate Pathway and Direct Entry programs where you will work alongside your American peers and earn credit towards your degree while improving your English skills. After successful completion of your program, you will be able to progress to a Suffolk degree program.

STUDY AT SUFFOLK'S MADRID CAMPUS



Boston isn't the only city we call home. Located in Spain, Suffolk's Madrid Campus offers students the opportunity to study in this world-class city. First-year direct entry students can choose to study in Madrid for up to two years before making the transition to Suffolk University in Boston. Government majors with a concentration in international relations can choose to fulfill all four years of their undergraduate degree at the Madrid campus. Any student can spend a semester or summer in Madrid, regardless of their major.

Why Madrid?

Madrid, a city full of vibrance and culture, is Spain's capital and home to a world of history and heritage. Its great cost of living makes it one of the most attractive study abroad cities in Europe. From multiple museums to a great culinary scene, there are many aspects to explore in Madrid. Having all of these options makes it a great hub for global connections. You will have the opportunity to immerse yourself in a new culture and a new language, enriching your study abroad experience and broadening your world view.

Suffolk's Madrid campus, located at the intersection of Avenida del Valle and Issac Peral, is nearby the city center and home to 150 students from all over the world. Whether you choose to spend a semester abroad in Madrid or longer, you will get the opportunity to learn Spanish and English.

We offer many undergraduate courses in a variety of subjects, including art history, business, communication, computer science, English, government, history, science, sociology, Spanish and general education requirements. Class sizes range from around 15-25 students, giving a personalized academic experience. We want you to feel at home, so we offer assistance with anything from academic to social support during your time on campus.

Benefits of On-campus Housing:

Assurance: University-sponsored residence halls are guaranteed for all incoming freshman for two years.

Productivity: Being so close to your classes, the library and study spaces helps you stay on top of your workload.

Convenience: You'll find public transit, shopping, restaurants, theaters and cultural attractions just steps from your new home.

Meal Plan:

Meal plans are required for students who live on-campus. Students who live off campus are able to purchase a meal plan, but it is not covered in the cost of their accommodation.

Curricular Practical Training and Optional Practical Training are both ways that you can explore your potential. Over the last three years, Suffolk has had 562 unique placements, allowing undergraduate and graduate students to take part in internships during and after their studies

What is Curricular Practical Training (CPT)? Curricular Practical Training allows international students in F-1 status to take part in professional or temporary employment.

What is Optional Practical Training (OPT)? Optional Practical Training allows international students in F-1 status to take part in professional or temporary employment that is directly related to the student's area of study, before or after they have graduated.

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS

We offer several routes to admission. With more than 60 bachelor's degrees, flexible study plans and start dates throughout the year, we will help you find the option that's right for you.

There's no need to stress about where you start; just focus on where you're going. You can complete your degree at any stage. We don't design our programs for one type of student; our programs are built for everyone. Where you will begin depends on your grades and English level. Where you end up is where you want to be: graduating with a bachelor's from Suffolk.

→ **DIRECT ENTRY:** If you meet the academic and English language requirements for your degree program, you can apply directly to Suffolk University.

To apply, you will need the following required documents: declarations, high school transcripts, university transcripts (for transfer applicants), proof of degree, personal statement, accounting of time, passport, English test score and proof of enrollment (transfer student only), recommendation letters and portfolio (Arts and Design). An application fee may apply. For more information, visit www.suffolk.edu/admission/international-students.

→ **INTERNATIONAL YEAR ONE:** International Year One allows you to begin earning credits toward your degree even if you don't meet the academic and English requirements for direct entry. You will receive additional support to help you successfully complete your first year and graduate in the same amount of time as direct entry students. 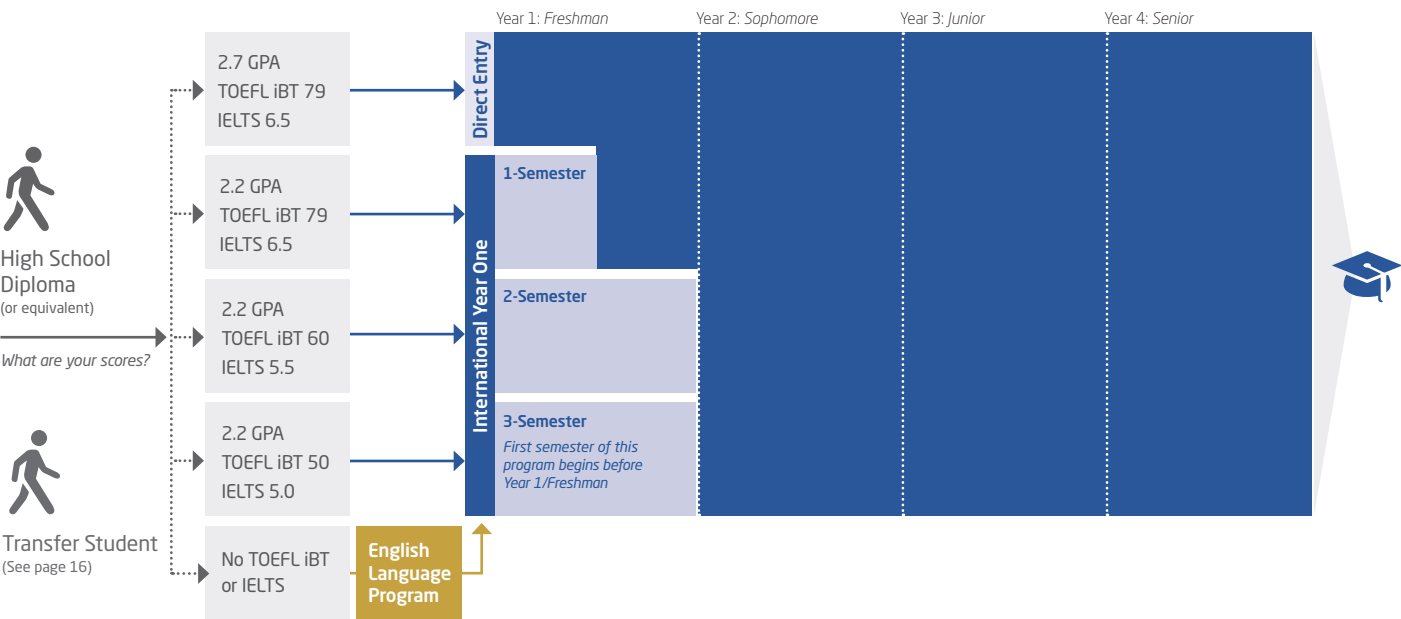

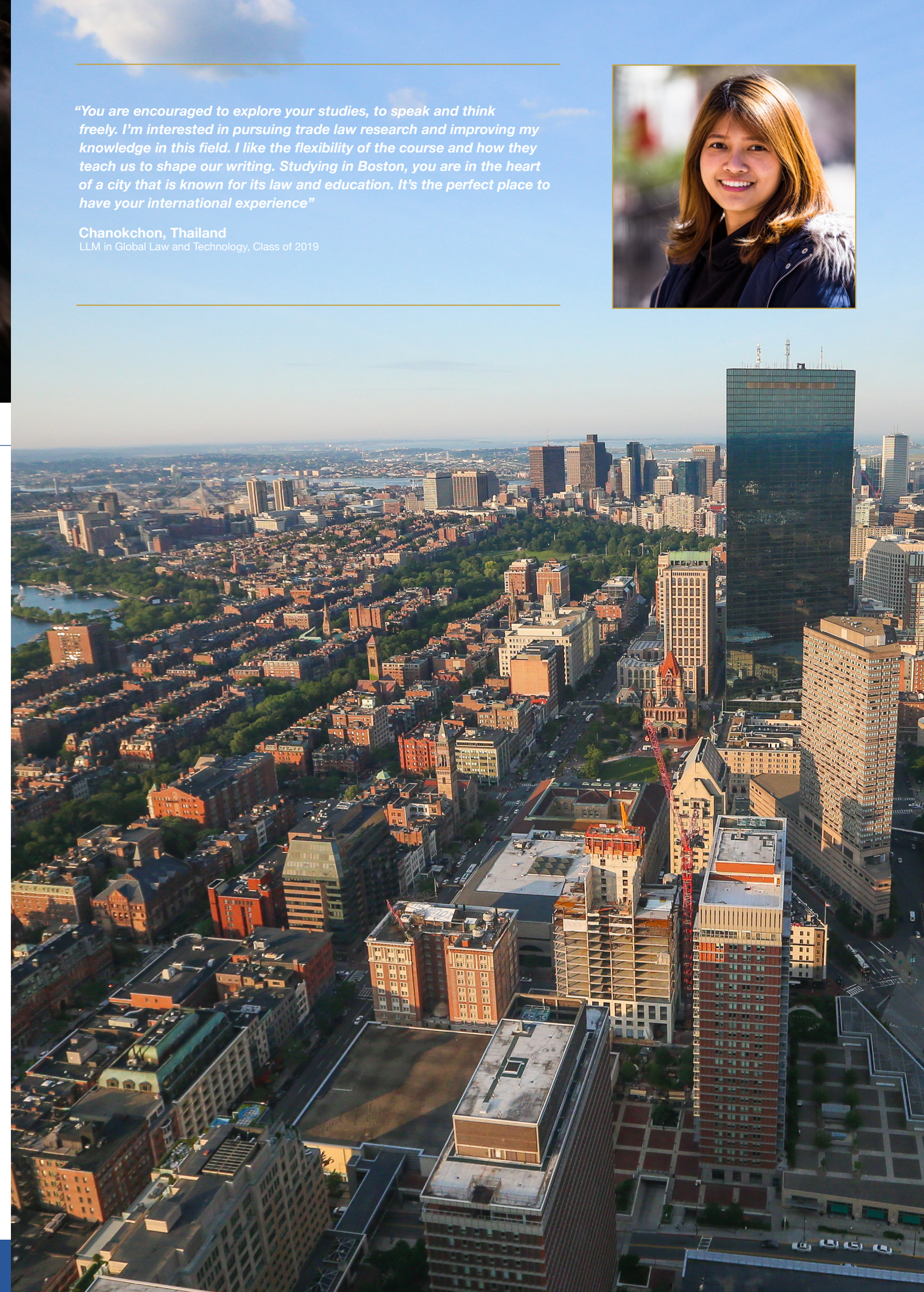

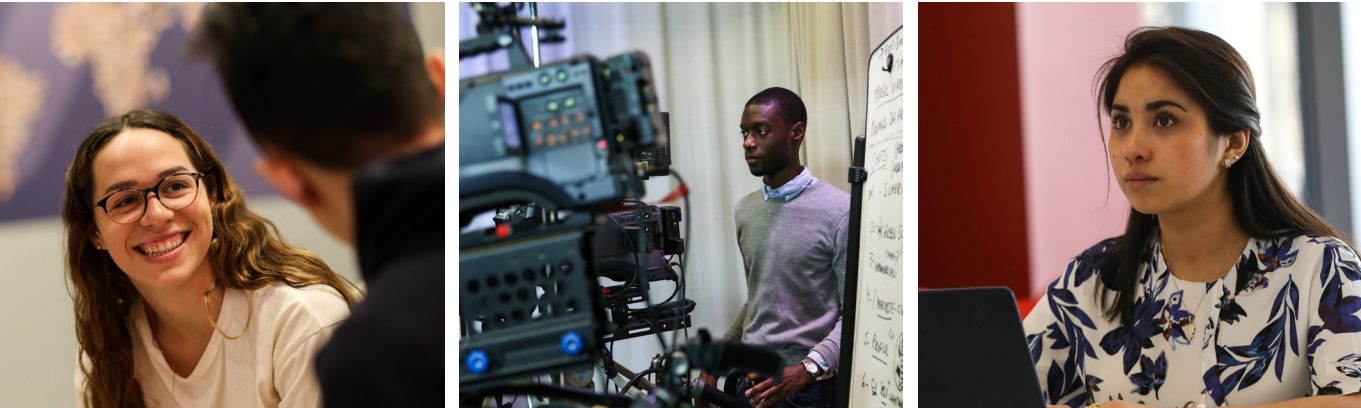
